Continuous Glucose Monitoring in Primary Care

This session will present an overview of CGM, including a review of CGM available in NZ and their application as a management tool for type 2 diabetes.

About the Speakers:

Dr. Tom Wilkinson

Tom Wilkinson is an adult endocrinologist and clinical senior lecturer at Christchurch School of Medicine. Tom's PhD research investigates automated insulin delivery systems in type 1 and type 2 diabetes, with a specific focus on novel 'fully closed-loop' systems that do not require meal announcement. He has also previously published research in general endocrinology.

Dr Tim Salmond

Dr Tim Salmond is a former physiotherapist and GP Fellow who works as a practice co-owner/GP in Gisborne, Te Tairāwhiti. He is undertaking his PhD through the University of Otago, in association with Mātai Medical Research Institute, focused on an RCT called DECODE which will investigate the addition of 10 weeks of CGM to an established DSME program. Aside from the primary outcome of TIR at 1 year, the study will measure health behaviours that affect glycaemia, and a sub-group will also have more intensive assessments including MRI of fat depots, indirect calorimetry at rest and with exercise, and a modified OGTT.
