When lobbying on behalf of General Practice Owners and Contracted Providers we engage and consult with our members on all matters relating to general practice and urgent care contracting to ensure that we represent their needs.

Purpose:

- We are a multidisciplinary rural membership organisation that works relentlessly to advocate for better conditions for health professionals.
- We are focused on the whole general practice team.
- Our special focus is on rural general practice, supporting a vision of equitable outcomes, resulting in: "Healthy and thriving rural communities."
- We recognise that to achieve this we need financially sustainable rural general practice.
- We are an organisation that upholds the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and work to exercise biculturalism at all levels of governance and operations.
- We understand the significant inequities in health outcomes for Māori across Aotearoa, especially in rural and remote rural areas.
 We are working to try to find and implement solutions that will address this inequity.

We also hold Government Contracts to provide locum support and recruit long-term GPs and NPs from overseas, to help provide viable workforces to rural general practices and rural hospitals across rural New Zealand. In addition, we work with our Students of Rural Health Chapter to tour rural areas and promote the spectrum of health professions to youth / rangatahi in those areas.

We are members of the General Practice Leaders Forum, working collaboratively with other like groups to understand all issues impacting General Practice, and advocating for viable and workable solutions to help ensure ongoing viability of General Practice.

Position Statement:

You should choose Hauora Taiwhenua Rural Health Network as your representative to PSAAP negotiations if you want to be represented by an organisation that is grounded in a membership that is embedded in the practicalities of General Practice, especially those in rural and remote rural areas. Our approach is consultative, inclusive and bicultural.

Our work is reflective of over 30 years of work in this area as the NZ Rural General Practice Network, before joining with a number of other rural groups to form Hauora Taiwhenua, in order to have a stronger and unified voice for advocacy.

The strength of our advocacy work can be evidenced in our impressive results including:

- Introduction of "rural adjuster" funding for rural general practice (NZRGPN).
- Advocacy for the introduction of the funded PRIME service to ensure rural communities received an emergency service where St John did not have the ability to provide cover (NZRGPN).
- Creation and subsequent running of a Government funded locum service for rural General Practice, and more recently, rural Hospitals.
- Getting changes to the draft Pae Ora Healthy Futures legislation so that rural communities are now recognised as priority communities. This has now resulted in the first ever Rural Health

- Strategy, a dedicated rural health team being established in Health New Zealand, and a funded action plan to ensure the rural strategy is achieved.
- Getting millions of dollars of support to provide rural practices with free locums during the COVID pandemic and also after climate emergencies such as Cyclone Gabrielle.
- Ensuring PRIME medical call-outs received separate funding, comparable to the fees paid by ACC for accident call-outs, and funding for Clinical Triage Calls.
- Working with our GPLF colleagues to get General Practice nurses included in partial pay parity recognition when the Minister initially ruled them out. We are still striving to get funding for General Practice so that full parity/equity can be made for practice nurses to be paid at the same rate as Te Whatu Ora nurses.
- Getting extra payment for rural practices to implement pre-call / recall processes for childhood immunisations.

We will strive to get the best outcomes from PSAAP discussions to ensure the financial viability of General Practice, with a focus on the unique challenges faced by delivering services in rural and remote rural communities with dispersed populations, often with high levels of social deprivation.

We have strong working relationships across all levels of Te Whatu Ora / Health NZ and Manatu Hauora / Ministry of Health.

While our unique focus is on delivery of General Practice in rural areas, we are happy to be chosen to represent urban practices who share our Kaupapa of inclusiveness, collaboration, consultation and equity.

Purpose:

WBOP PHO is a jointly owned registered limited company with charitable status. The PHO owners are Provider Inc (a local provider organisation but not solely, representing local General Practices) and the two largest local Iwi, Ngāi te rangi and Ngāti Rānginui. The PHO Board is made up of four members of Western Bay of Plenty Primary Care Incorporated, known as Providers Inc., plus four Iwi representatives, two from each Iwi. The Board is co-chaired by one member from Providers Inc. and one Iwi member. The Chief Executive of WBOP PHO is Lindsey Webber.

Our purpose is to support our provider network to achieve whai mana (equity), whai ora (quality healthcare) and whai rangatiratanga (sustainability) for all, with a focus on eliminating health inequities, particularly for Māori.

We are motivated and committed to enabling people to protect their own health and wellbeing, eliminating inequities and improving health outcomes. We will do this by working together - mahi tahi, working in true partnership for transformational change.

Position Statement:

As a not-for-profit organisation, we work explicitly to benefit the public good. The commercial activities of our organisation, along with funding and contracts to deliver services, are invested into achieving our vision and ensuring we have the capacity and capability to support our practices, partners and the populations they support.

We play an enabling role by both supporting and delivering primary health care services and we work closely with others who also deliver primary and community-based services, including our iwi partners and general practice network providers.

We believe in the value of authentic partnerships as more than just contractual arrangements. They are rooted in transparency, open communication, and a sincere desire to achieve common goals.
